### Updated Home Reading Guidance

From next Monday you will notice a change in your KS1 and KS2 child's Reading Record Book. We have updated our Home Reading Guidance (attached) which is stuck inside the front cover of our pupils' reading records. We continue to expect pupils to read at least 5 times a week at home and get their reading record signed by an adult, but we want to place a greater emphasis on pupils frequently reading their colour banded school reading book. In KS1 reading (and re reading) a colour banded book (at least twice) will aid confidence and fluency. In KS2 the new emphasis is on sustaining reading over a longer period of time and regularly finishing whole books is crucial for their development from '*learning to read to reading to learn*'. Please take a moment to review our updated advice for home reading. Your support and commitment to reading with your child at home could not be more important for their development as readers.

## Ivy Lane Library

Our library is cosy and welcoming on these cold winter days, but for those children who have so far been disappointed by the lack of snow in Chippenham, we have a selection of snowy stories to read instead. These beautiful winter picture books are on our central display and are available to borrow now.

Our new featured author is Cressida Cowell. Best known for her 'How To Train Your Dragon' series, she had an interesting childhood split between homes in London and a remote, uninhabited island off the west coast of Scotland where there was no electricity! No wonder she has such an amazing imagination and an amazing gift for storytelling.

Your support in helping your child to remember to return their library book each week is much appreciated. Books must be returned or renewed weekly when your child visits the library with their class.

## New Complaints Policy

Can we please draw your attention to a change in our Complaints Policy (full version on the website) agreed by the Governors:

### Raising Concerns

The majority of concerns can be dealt with without resorting to the formal complaints procedure. Where you have a concern about any aspect of the school or your child's education or wellbeing, your first point of contact is your child's class teacher or the Key Stage Leader. If you can, please speak directly to them (we ask that this is done after school and not at the start of the school day). Alternatively, you can speak with the Pastoral Manager in the morning. Hopefully, they will be able to address your concerns swiftly, or arrange a meeting with you to discuss the issue.

You can also raise a concern via the office by telephone (preferably) or by e-mail. Please note that we will do our best to respond to emails within 5 school days and a verbal discussion will generally also be necessary. (Please speak directly to us if you require a quicker response). We cannot commit to resolving all concerns and complaints solely by e-mail.

A face to face meeting maybe necessary to resolve concerns raised to enable discussion and to share information.
