# Dear Parents/Carers of Ivy Lane,

Following our return to school after the half-term break, school life has brought many opportunities for learning both and outside the classroom. Year 4 are currently deep in rehearsals for their Spring Performance of Cinderella and to get them performance ready, they thoroughly enjoyed their trip to London yesterday to watch the West End musical of 'The Lion King'. This annual Year 4 trip is funded by our FOILS team, providing our children with a memorable learning experience.

Year 2 launched with a rail safety workshop, before embarking on their train trip from Chippenham to Bristol Temple Meads. We are pleased to say that through a charity called Platform, which links classrooms to local railways, the school secured this fully funded trip. The children travelled along Brunel's historic Great Western Railway and experienced going through Box Tunnel, both of which they have been learning about this term as part of their enquiry, "What did Brunel do for Great Britain?" Once they reached Temple Meads, the children took part in a Brunel workshop focussing on the Great Western Railway. They had a fantastic day, that was made more special by seeing the show of hands of children that shared that this was their first ever train ride!

At the end of this week, we welcome Mrs Shears, to our Teaching Assistant Team and will be based in Year 1, Hargreaves. Mrs Shears comes with experience working with children in both local primary schools and also overseas. We know our children and staff will make her feel welcome as she joins the Ivy Lane family. We are also pleased to share that Mr Prince, who currently works as a TA, Learning Tutor and Ivy Kidz playworker, has secured a promotion and will now work alongside Play Leader, Senora Merry, as Ivy Kidz After-School Supervisor. Also joining the Ivy Kidz playworker team is our very own Miss Milani, who works as Assistant Cook. She will switch from her chef's hat, to join the hard-working team providing quality after school care for our Ivy Lane children.

As we look ahead to the next few weeks, we have our World Book Day activities, Netball Tournament at Sheldon School, Year 1 Easter Orienteering Event at Hardenhuish, local library visits and last but not least, our annual whole school Performance Poetry event!

We look forward to welcoming you to our second Parents' Evening consultations this year, on 19<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> March, where the teachers will have an opportunity to discuss your child's progress. #### CHILDRENS ATTENDANCE

Dear Parents and Carers,

The below is an excerpt from the Children's Commissioner's Attendance Audit. Improving school attendance is an absolute priority for the Children's Commissioner. Children are offered the best start to further their ambitions, relationships and learning when they are in school.

However, despite the importance of being in school, following the pandemic school absence rates have become stuck at crisis levels. Last year, over 1 in 5 children were persistently absent, meaning they missed on average at least a day a fortnight in school.

In the Attendance Audit, the Children's Commissioner talked to hundreds of children who are regularly absent from school. Children aren't absent from school because they don't want to learn. They are desperate to learn yet everyday thousands of children find themselves without the support that they need to engage in education.

Attendance needs to be everybody's business – all agencies involved in supporting children must make tackling school absences their priority.

At Ivy Lane our children's attendance is monitored daily and each month those children whose attendance is below 96% is recorded. We only want to support our families especially if they are going through harder times. We are also very aware that at this time of year there have been numerous bugs and viruses going around as well.

If you are concerned about your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to contact our Pastoral Manager - Mrs Adams.

It is a statutory requirement for schools, that If your child's attendance has fallen below expected levels you should receive a letter and be invited into the school to see if there is anything we can do to help.

#### 12-week consultation opens for proposed new Community Safety Plan


A 12-week consultation has been launched for Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority's proposed new Community Safety Plan.

The plan sets out the priorities and challenges for Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service from now until 2028, covering areas such as prevention, protection, response, governance and people.

Chief Fire Officer Ben Ansell said: "The plan details how we intend to continue working, but also what we intend to review and do differently to meet and reduce the risks we face as an organisation. Public sector finances are under extreme pressure, so it is vital that we look at all parts of the Service to ensure that we are working as efficiently and as effectively as possible."

The consultation runs from 9am on Friday 9 February until 9am on Friday 3 May. Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Authority will then consider the consultation responses and the final plan at its meeting in June. Cllr Rebecca Knox, Chair of the Authority, said: "The Community Safety Plan is our 'roadmap' for the coming years, so the views of people from across our communities are essential. Whether you are a resident, a local business, a partner, a voluntary group or a charity, we would very much like to hear from you."
