
CHILDREN IN NEED

Children in Year 3 and Year 5 had a memorable experience this week thanks to funding from FOILS.

"I hope the planetarium met the expectations of your colleagues today. I really enjoyed delivering the programme and found the students to be happy, enthusiastic and excited by the experience. We were warmly welcomed by the staff and found the hall prepared just as we had requested. The morning was well organised with all groups arriving on time. The excited students enjoyed a rich selection of content: peering up at the planetarium night sky; visiting the Space Station; handling a famous meteorite; learning about the Moon and a future colonised Solar System. On Monday, Ivy Lane were visited by a Planetarium because of our enquiry 'Where does the darkness come from?' First, we saw the constellations like the flying horse, the frying pan the bear and the north star. Next, we looked at the International Space Station. It is as big as a football pitch! After that, we looked at meteorites. One landed in North America - it was the size of our school! (We even got to hold a little bit of it!) Finally, we looked at how when the sun goes down in the East, the moon comes up on the West. It was a great morning.

Do you receive any of the following?

- Income suppor
- Employment Support Allowance (Income Related)
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Guaranteed Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit <u>and</u> your income (as calculated by the Inland Revenue) is less than £16,190
- Universal Credit
- Receiving support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act of 1999
- In the Armed Forces

If you can answer yes to any of the above you may qualify for free school meals/Pupil Premium

The school office will help with your application. If your application is successful not only will your child receive free school meals, but our school will receive £1,300 additional funding (per child). This is called Pupil Premium.

All applications are confidential.
